N. Cornell Boggs, III is Chief Responsibility and Ethics Officer for MillerCoors. He is responsible for ensuring the company lives up to their commitment to respect the consumers, communities, and the planet.

Previously, Boggs was Chief Legal Officer and Group Vice President of Public Affairs for Coors Brewing Company where he was responsible for legal, government affairs, corporate communications, alcohol responsibility, and water and natural resources.

Prior to joining Coors in 2005, Boggs served as Vice President and General Counsel for Tyco Plastics and Adhesives in Princeton, N.J. Earlier in his career, he served as Associate General Counsel with Anheuser-Busch, where he was commercial law counsel for the corporate engineering, purchasing, marketing and distribution groups. Boggs also previously served as Americas Regional Counsel for Intel Corporation and Assistant Company Counsel with Monsanto Company.

Boggs began his career with an earned appointment to the honors program with the U.S. Department of Justice, a prestigious two-year litigation opportunity in which he represented the interests of the United States in court.

Boggs has received national recognition for his legal career. In March 2005, he was featured on the cover of Corporate Counsel magazine as part of its annual list of 10 promising lawyers who can be expected to head the legal functions of leading U.S. and international corporations. Active in the legal community, Boggs serves on the boards of directors of Valparaiso University, the Minority Corporate Counsel Association, the Association of Corporate Counsel and the Denver Metro Chamber of Commerce.
